From the desk of the Editor, March 2019

As the various bits and pieces come together I wonder where did all this stuff come from, and, more importantly, where is it all going? Probably not as far as I hope. There are always some items that are not on hand and probably not easily found. Parts motors may provide a desired item but will also yield items I have in excess of any need. Anyway, a few hours effort to reunite a couple power heads and a couple towers complete with clamp assembly and gear foot clear a little space on shelf and work bench. Visual progress if not actual progress.

Around here, this past Winter has been mostly a no-show non-event. A friend in the hobby at Council Bluffs, Iowa reports a very different Winter filled with blizzards, record-setting cold, ending with a heavy snowfall, followed by heavy rain and a rapid thaw. The resulting high water and flooding are also unwelcome record setting events. I have not heard how or whether he is affected. Directly or indirectly, a lot of people are impacted now and may be for years ahead.

A few weeks ago I had the opportunity to look over a trove of 1940's thru 1960's outboard motors and parts. Evidently from an old marine repair shop that closed perhaps as far back as the 1970's.
